

LEADERSHIP EDUCATION, THEORY, AND PRACTICE - CERTIFICATE

The certificate in Leadership Education, Theory, and Practice is an innovative program that prepares students with the unique knowledge and skills required to apply leadership theory and put into practice these theories at any level in an organization. Students will gain a substantive foundation of leadership theory, with the instructional focus on leadership situations and how to apply leadership theories to all professional organizations, including professional and civic.

This certificate requires the completion of 12 credit hours and may be completed as: 1) Part of a degree program or 2) by applying as a certificate-option only (non-degree status). When completed as part of a degree program or as a certificate-option only (non-degree status), the student will need to apply for graduation to have the certificate recognized and transcribed.

This program is also approved for delivery via asynchronous distance education technology.
