

APPLIED BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS - CERTIFICATE

The Department of Educational Psychology offers a Certificate in Applied Behavior Analysis which is designed for school-based professionals, direct service providers, and job coaches who work with individuals with autism spectrum disorders, developmental disabilities, or other unique needs that require behavioral interventions.

The coursework consists of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) content with a specific focus on application in education. Coursework meets requirements by the Association for Behavior Analysis International (ABAI) as a verified course sequence (VCS) and satisfies the BACB's coursework requirements to sit for the Board-Certified Behavior Analyst exam. Students must have a master's degree to apply to the ABA Certificate program.

This program is also approved for delivery via asynchronous or synchronous distance education technology.
