³ Students must take a foreign language placement test if they:

- intend to enroll for the first time in a college Spanish, French, German, Russian, Arabic, Chinese, Japanese, Classical Greek, Italian, or Latin course and
- have knowledge of the language acquired in any way

The placement test serves as a basis for credit by examination. Placement tests are offered throughout the calendar year by the Department Global Languages and Cultures.

Students who have taken the Advanced Placement (AP) test or the Reading Achievement test in their foreign language of choice may substitute the test results for the placement exam.

Electives

To enhance the traditionally broad background of the graduate, undergraduate students are allowed to include in their degree program a minimum of 9 semester hours of free elective courses. All other elective hours must be selected with the approval of the student's advisor and dean.
